The EEDC is primarily funded by the Town of Erie. Secondary funding comes from our members, investors, partners, and champions. In 2019, the EEDC began a new membership called "New Erie Businesses" for just \$100 for their first year. The EEDC understood that starting a new business can be an expensive adventure but the organization wanted to give these businesses a great foundation at an affordable price. This option allowed businesses to make relationships quickly with other successful businesses and have access to all of the EEDC's helpful resources. This was a successful option and we are excited to continue offering it in 2020.

Erie has an abundance of resources for businesses to grow. This past year the EEDC took time to invest in relationships by participating in the Leads Group which was created by Ben Pratt, the Town of Erie's Economic Development Director. This group works together to make sure there are no gaps in services and that everyone is working in a team effort to provide the best service to the Erie business community. This group includes the EEDC, Erie Chamber, Town of Erie Economic Development Team, Small Business Development Center, and Upstate Colorado. The EEDC expresses its appreciation to the Town of Erie for beginning this initiative.

Outside of this work, the EEDC also attended the NAIOP Golf Tournament, sent representatives to the Northern Colorado Manufacturing Trade Show, and continually reaches out to commercial realtors to build relationships with potential new Erie businesses. The EEDC also has supported the efforts of CoSolve, Erie's newest businesses for coworking community, and collaboration by hosting its first event and assisting with communication of the project to Erie businesses and citizens.
